restructure born by the former instrumentalities and (2) the effects of any reduction in the mandates of any
 covenanted ministry, due to "off the top funding." Ms. Rose Lee (JWM) seconded the motion.

4 Mr. Bill Morgan proceeded by providing background information on the amendment. Mr. David Greenhaw 5 (MOMS) spoke against the amendment and questioned whether this served as an attempt to renegotiate allocations. 6 He then stated that these are some of the consequences of General Synod as well as the decision not to approve less 7 frequent Synods. Ms. Marilyn Pagan (ILL) spoke in favor of the amendment. She felt the Covenanted Ministries 8 should not bear the brunt of the decisions about General Synod. Mr. Aaron Gould (ME) reminded delegates that 9 General Synod belongs to, and is the responsibility of, everyone. Therefore, the funding should come off the top, as 10 General Synod serves as a common mission. Ms. Phyllis Gant (MOMS) asked the question, "How do we do the work of the church without the funds? She then requested a call for the vote on the amendment. Mr. Luther 11 Holland (ILL) called for clarity of the motion on the floor. After Rev. John Thomas attempted to provide clarity on 12 13 the motion, a motion was made to stop debate.

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15 05-GS-48 VOTED: The Twenty-fifty General Synod votes to stop debate on the amendment to the National Basic
 Support Allocation base of \$10.7 million and \$11 million for the budget years 2006 and 2007.

05-GS-49 VOTED: The Twenty-fifth General Synod adopts the following Our Church's Wider Mission National Basic Support Allocation percentages for the 2006 and 2007 biennium: Executive Council (0%); Office of General Ministries (22.5%); Justice and Witness Ministries (17.35%); Local Church Ministries (29.40%); Wider Church Ministries (23.65%); Pension Boards (7.05%); United Church Foundation (0%). The General Synod also authorizes the Executive Council, at its October 2005 meeting, to make necessary changes to the allocation based on additional information that is not available at this time.

## 29 <u>5. PRONOUNCEMENT: "MINISTRY ISSUES: FORMING AND PREPARING PASTORAL LEADERS</u> 30 <u>FOR GOD'S CHURCH"</u>

31 Assistant Moderator Eric Smith called on Mr. Jonathan Dean-Lee, Chair of Committee One who moved the 32 approval of the pronouncement "Ministry Issues: Forming and Preparing Pastoral Leaders for God's Church."

33

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Mr. Lee gave a brief summary and plan of action for the pronouncement, "Forming and Preparing Pastoral Leaders for God's Church." He then stated an open forum was held on Friday and written responses were shared. He then referenced the recommended changes.

Ms. Leslie Taylor (OH) questioned whether the noted changes on page eleven were part of the action.

40 Mr. Quinton Chin (MASS) referenced sections "1D subsection (c)" as it relates to the racial and ethnic groups, and 41 noted they are often under-represented on Church and Ministry, so this is intended as a vision and goal. He then 42 asked whether the Gay, Lesbian, Bi-sexual and Transgendered persons were considered. The response was no, 43 because it wasn't there, but that each conference can adapt the proposal for their own purposes.

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45 Mr. Dave Mears (IOWA) spoke in favor of the pronouncement. Mr. Duane Romberger and Ms. Loring McGreal, 46 spoke as seminarians of the United Church of Christ, and expressed concern on how this would affect the health of 47 seminaries and staff. Also, whether it would replace the class system. Mr. Romberger stated that Seminary 48 campuses should be seen as the meeting place, and was in opposition to the resolution. He further suggested that a 49 larger study should be done. Mr. Gene Miller (SD) sees the pronouncement as a benefit. Although it is not perfect, 50 it can benefit the United Church of Christ as a starting place. Seminaries will need to develop new resources, and the mentoring process can be strengthened. Ms. Ann Emery (CAC) was concerned that seminary leadership was not 51 involved in the recommendations. Their input serves as the theological foundation of these recommendations for 52 alternative paths. She also went on to say that she hopes it is not implied that people of color cannot meet the 53 54 standard.

55

Ms. Kay Loudon (VT) offered a motion to refer "Ministry Issues: Forming and Preparing Pastoral Leaders for God's Church," to the Executive Council with the charge to form a committee consisting of, but not limited to, representatives from: 1) Council for Theological Education 2) Parish Life and Leadership (3) Seminarians of the United Church of Christ related seminaries, chosen by their peers, and 4) The Council of Conference Ministers to further examine and clarify all aspects of the current Ministry Issues Proclamation, and to report back to General Synod. The motion to refer was seconded.

- 8 Mr. Gene Kraus (IS) reminded delegates that this motion was proposed at the 1999 General Synod in Providence.
- 10 The motion to refer this pronouncement to Executive Council was defeated.

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Assistant Moderator Smith returned to the main motion. After further discussion, Mr. Robert von Trebrot (ILL) proposed the following amendment under Section I.c: delete "the Statement of Faith and." The amendment was seconded.

## 33 STATEMENT OF CHRISTIAN CONVICTION

32 33 34

The Twenty-fifth General Synod of the United Church of Christ affirms that our baptism calls us all to minister in Christ's name. Within the church, some are called to particular leadership roles in order to "equip the saints for the work of ministry" (Ephesians 4:12, NRSV).

38

The Twenty-fifth General Synod affirms the current forms of authorized ministry: ordained, licensed, and commissioned. We believe that Christ's Church needs well-prepared and faithful servants to engage in God's mission.

42

The Twenty-fifth General Synod believes that the United Church of Christ, along with the whole Christian church and every individual Christian, is called into God's mission in the world. We believe that in this mission, uniquely ours in Jesus Christ, we are empowered by the Holy Spirit. We believe that God's mission requires all the gifts and graces given by God to its members and to the church itself. We believe that the church requires faithful and effective leadership in order to respond to Jesus' call. We believe that each generation must be ready to change its practices of church life in response to the Spirit's call for each generation.

49

50 The Twenty-fifth General Synod celebrates and gives thanks for the gifts of God and the call of Christ to the United 51 Church of Christ and its members. Those gifts include a diversity of faith communities, a resolution to welcome 52 fully all of God's children, a rich and diverse heritage, countless faithful leaders, and openness to Christ's call to 53 faithfully witness to God's love in ways appropriate for new times and situations.

54

The Twenty-fifth General Synod invites all in the United Church of Christ to join in repentance of those actions and practices which have prevented the leadership of some of its members from being effectively recognized,

encouraged and authorized. As repentance requires change, we pledge ourselves and invite others to join in 1 2 developing new patterns of calling forth leaders, of equipping them for service, and of authorizing and supporting their ministries on behalf of the United Church of Christ. 3

4

5 The Twenty-fifth General Synod recognizes that in a church with many diversities, there must also be many patterns 6 of leadership and, therefore, of discernment of call, preparation, authorization, and continuing covenantal 7 relationships. At the same time, we affirm that we are called to be one church and, therefore, we will continue to 8 develop common understandings of ministry and leadership and live together into faithfulness by the power of God's Spirit. 9

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THEREFORE, the Twenty-fifth General Synod commits itself and calls upon all members and settings of the United 11 Church of Christ to: 12 13

- Listen for God's call to mission and respond in faith;
- ٠ Participate actively in the discernment of call of particular persons to become authorized ministers of the church:
- Participate actively with called persons in discerning the appropriate ministerial vocation; ٠
- Develop, support and engage in multiple patterns of preparation for authorized ministers, recognizing that preparation must be appropriate for the individual, the particular faith community, the United Church of Christ, and the ministry for which authorization is requested;
- Enter and live in continuing covenantal relationship with those authorized for ministry on behalf of the • United Church of Christ, honoring and supporting all - commissioned, ordained, and licensed;
  - Expect and encourage all authorized ministers to be lifelong learners, accountable to one another and the church for their learning and their ministry;
  - Repent of all that has prevented us from faithfulness in the past, while continuing to give thanks for those whose leadership has brought us to this time and those who beckon us forward.
